As of the first of October 1993 I resigned both my elected position es President of NFSS and my eppointed position es Editor of the NFSS Bulletin.





"A MAN WITHOUT GUILE"

As I near the half-century mark, I have been doing a lot of reminiscing. I was born and related in Idaho and spent my first seventeen years there. Most of them in a small farming community named Lewieville. My fother was a fermer and when that didn't succeed, he made his living as a blue collar worker. He only completed the sixth grade but knew more about the lend and how to repair things than most of us have ever learned. He was well thought of in Lewisville; active in the local church and served several terms on the town coancil. He was seked to serve as Mayor, but declined due to feeling insdequets.

When he died the charch was overflowing at his famerel. It was at the funeral that one of the apeakers made an observation that I have never forgotten. He eaid it could be said of my father that he was like Nathaniel who was celled as an apostle of Christ — "o man without gaile".

Webster defines gaile os "deceitful canning - duplicity". Being without gaile means being straight forward in ail dealings with others, being honest - not trying to trick or take edventage of others.

Ever since then I have tried to emalate my father's example. I have not always sacceeded but I hope to have the same said of me when I pass on.

Think of ahot thet means, to be without gaile. When we decided to become actively involved in breeding birds we began looking for appropriate stock. One of our first parchases was at the Bird Mort here in Las Vegos. A member was selling a banded breeding pair of Timneh African Greya. Guaranteed they were mele and female. Our next purchase was a pair of Mitred Conaree at the Pomona Sird Mart. Several months later, after finally having both "pairs" sexed, we found out they were all fewoles. Even though we had been warned, we found out the hard way that there is plenty of guile in the bird boeiness.

What did it gain the people that ared deceit to sell their birde?
Whenever I go to Pomona I avoid that vendor and advice othere to do so also. So he goined one sale and has lost ancounted others. I thinh that is what happene to most people who practice guile - they have to find new people to fool, ahether it be in business or in lifs. Whot a miserable say to live!

i recommend that we go out of our way to be honest in all our dealings and more so in regard to birds. It's difficult, especially in this day and age. But, it will be worth lot and, os my father, we will be respected as being without gails.

To the members of The Mational Finch and Seftbill Society

The last time I wrote to all of you wan in late May. The topic thea wan the "board meeting by mail" and the openies letter and a nincere "thank you" for the matherization yoe had given to Miki Sparzak and Al Decutanu for their "surprise" gift of the elevmo hummingbird prints, at a cent of \$488. I am still amazed that yoe authorized that expenditore from the treasury and still pleaned that you thought so highly of me that you thought that I am morthy of se expensive a gift. According to Al, who originated the idea and counted the votes, only too Board members dinagreed with him idea.

With those thoughts in mied, this letter in evmo more difficult to arite. Throughout the month of Septmober I spent a great deal of time evaluating my priorities and annenning my feture commitments. A few of the decisions I reached acre very personal ones. I had my hair cut, a dramatic change after 18 years of loag heir, and I blac started apering "the patch" so that I could quit smoking.

Then came the most difficult and arenchiag decision. I know that many of you have been seriously disappointed in my performance as editor and you have been justified in being annoyed with the Builetin being late. As I have before, I spologize again for the late issues.

As many of you know I have become very much committed to the rehabilitation of nild birds and I am honorod to lead a group of rehabilitators that have received over 188 birds in 1993 and have managed to release over 18% of thmo back into the aild. Wild bird rehab and being your Bullotin aditor do not mix well. To be totally committed to a publication deadline a person example totally committed to the apontaneity and floxibility that is demended of wild-bird rehabilitators. When impured or orphaned birds arrive on my doorstep they example that till I'm done typing and you should not have to wait till I make splints and feed chicks for your Bulletin to be assembled.

I em not a person aho is aeli suited to dealing aith hard deedlines. I know that you winh that I had realized that earlier and I do too. The decision to give up editing the Sullatin in fevor of continuing to deal nith a crisis-adey in the wild bird rahab wasn't too hard for me and is much more fair to you than for me to continuo to make you wait while I try to reseccitate Caroline Wreas. By the second week of September I had decided to resign as Bulletin Editor.

During this time | had nevernl personal querrele with Al Docoteeu and nith Miki Sparzek over decisions that sherply defined our differences of opinion on ethics and propriety. Those differences of opinion may yet become public but | will not make them peblic at this time.

Then, in the lant week of September, Miki Sparzak called me and teld me that she had heard rumorn that noveral members had become no displeased with me, personally, that they had decided to quit NFSS and form amother national organization of finch fanciera. Whether that story was true or not I do not know but I way so upaet by that idea that it only took me 12 hours to decide to also resign as prevident, in the hopey that if the story wey true, that my resignation would cause those members to recognider and not leave MFSS. When I made that decision, I called Bill Parlee, the founder of MFSS, and then year him a fax, deted September 30, that included my resignation as Prevident and Editor of MFSS.

At that time I told him on the phone that I wanted out of the positions as uoon au possible and that I hoped he would be able to notify the persons who needed to know that I had reuigned, effective as of that date and that I would assemble one more issue of the Bulletin and that I would cooperate as fully as possible in the transition. I realize now that I should have taken responsibility for notifying the membership of those things myself and I regret that I did not do that.

In the paut 6 weeks I have heard numerous rumors about the reasons I have left those two pouitions. I have chosen to write this letter to tell you my pouition. I think you and I deaerve that. If you have further questions, I hope that you will keep in touch with Bruce and me in the future.

It has been an honor to serve es the President of this acciety end I uil! always consider it as one of my greetest pleasures to have met so many dedicated finch fenciers. I wish all of you well and I hope your flocks prosper and you and your families thrive. ! will continue to judge a few shows each year and I will be en ective participant in FINCHSAVE with the species we are now keeping and perhaps more, and so I will continue to be in touch with many of you in those capacities.

Thank you for your good will and your good wishes. I hope that you will wish my rehabilitation group ell the best, es I wish all the best for MFSS and for each of its individual memberu.
