State of the Society Message

I helieve the founding members of NFSS had several important long-term goals in mind when they established the National Finch and Soft-bill Society in 1984. Their goals, set many years ago, were intended to meet the diverse needs of aviculturists keeping, breeding, and/or exhibiting finches and softbills. Due to the diligent efforts and teamwork of our founding members, past and present administrations, and our membership, NFSS has achieved satisfaction of these goals and prospers in the 90's.

Now entering its second decade, NFSS (a non-profit organization) continues to dedicate itself to promoting interest in the keeping and breeding of finches and softbills, educating members in the care of these birds, encouraging breeding programs, and cooperating with organizations for the preservation of aviculture in this country.

Today, NFSS is proud to have one thousand-plus members and affiliated clubs representing the United States, Canada, Puerto Rico, Bermuda, Great Britain, the Philippines. Australia and New Zealand — all striving to achieve their avian-related goals.

Our important members and affiliated clubs contribute to the health and well-being of the Society by promoting and supporting our "finch and softbill family" in various ways. Members display their birds (various species of finches and softbills) at bird shows around the world helping to promote the fancy and stimulate interest in the general public as well as the seasoned aviculturist. Members suhmit interesting and educational articles for publication in The NFSS Bulletin to "share the knowledge", with the hope of assisting or encouraging members in their bird keeping and breeding efforts. The involvement, hard work and support of our hreeder members, with strong conservation goals, has helped the FINCHSAVE Program become one of aviculture's foremost cooperative breeding programs.

Club Affiliates with NFSS

NFSS affiliated clubs promote the finch and softbill fancy through bird shows, seminars, conventions, swap meets, and club consortiums. They receive our bi-monthly Bulletin in which their club, the club's delegate and phone number are listed along with their show or event date, to reach those interested in aviculture. Affiliated clubs have the opportunity to choose awards ranging from service awards to plaques and/or rosettes for their club-sponsored show or event. In 1995, they will also receive a handsome Eric Peake "Diamoud Firetail" lithograph as part of their affiliation, to do with as they see fir

The NFSS Bulletin

NFSS considers the sharing of knowledge and educational information important factors that contribute to the growth of the membership, and strives to offer the membership these benefits.

The NFSS Bulletin, a bi-monthly publication, is our main communicator to the membership and has always been praised as a valuable educational resource for our membership, especially our junior members. In the last year and a half, NFSS' Publications department has acquired a new editor with fresh and exciting new ideas. She has created an NFSS publication that is drawing much acclaim for its professional look and wide extent of finch and softbill coverage. Members will find

interesting and educational articles, ranging from the keeping and caring of birds to breeding, banding, showing, avian medicine, and of course, legislation affecting aviculture. The *Bulletin* also offers members classified advertising to purchase, trade or sell birds, commercial advertising, and free FINCHSAVE inquiries.

NFSS Publications

Over the years, several educational publications have been produced by NFSS, including the 1985 Judges Handbook. the 1991 First Edition of Standards, and the 1992/93 Official NFSS Handbook. The Handbook has now become a part of the membership package and replaces one issue of The NFSS Bulletin each year. The revised, newest edition of the Judges Handbook includes a general standard and many species specific standards written and adopted by NFSS, and will be available in the near future.

Exhibition with NFSS

NFSS Panel Judges also contribute to the educational aspects of the Society through the judging of bird shows. The judges' knowledge and experience help make bird shows a learning experience for all in attendance. The majority of finches and softbills at shows are classified and benched before the gallery in order of geographical origin and judged according to conformation, color, condition, demeanor and presentation. At these one- or two-day shows.

aviculturists have the opportunity to see and study many different species which they have only read about. The species standards utilized by judges during exhibition can be applied to both birds for exhibition and for use in breeding programs, and are often discussed and explained to the gallery.

Educational Outreach: Displays, Video, Speakers

Our "display boards" continue to be requested for promotional and educational avian events and invigorate interest in the finch and softbill fancy.

The NFSS video "The Wonderful World of Finches and Soltbills: An Introduction", available to all, is a tribute to many species of birds. Within NFSS, we are also fortunate to have talented and resourceful members that avail themselves as speakers at various avian functions. Through slide or video presentations. NFSS speakers enlighten and enhance aviculturists' knowledge on various aspects of the finch and softbill fancy.

FINCHSAVE!

The FINCHSAVE Program, established in 1988, is one of our strongest and most important assets. Dedicated to the preservation of finches and softbills in the United States, FINCHSAVE encourages members and club consortiums to become participants of our "established consortium of breeders of finches

and softbills" and help maintain viable captive-bred populations of finches and softbills. Over the years the numbers of participants, species and birds enrolled have steadily increased. Today we have over 600 birds registered! Currently the FINCHSAVE department is working on additional preservation projects, including the Census and Waxbill Survey.

NFSS Annual Census

The annual NFSS Census remains a valuable service which provides a means of communication between our conservation-conscious finch and softbill breeders by assisting these breeders in the acquisition and maintenance of various bloodlines, and helps FINCHSAVE keep records of finch and softbill species currently in captivity. The voluntary Census report published in The NFSS Bulletin includes names of breeders. the state in which they reside, species they are working with and their telephone numbers. The 1994 census is the most successful in our history. with over 115 members responding from the United States. Canada and Puerto Rico. Reports indicate numerous breeders are now working with several more pairs per specie than in the past. This will hopefully ensure a greater diversity of bloodlines which breeders will have to strengthen future generations of captive birds.

9 Leg Band Sizes!

NFSS offers the membership 9 different sizes of the highest quality. closed, traceable leg bands which provide proper labeling and proof of domestic-raised finches and softbills. NFSS bands can accommodate the smallest of waxbills up to, and including small doves, quail, and other softbills. 1994 was a record year for band sales, selling a total of 34,000 hands. In just the first half of this year our membership has purchased over 36,500 bands! To assist members with their propagation efforts and encourage closed banding of young. The NFSS Bulletin routinely publishes a guide for selecting and ordering appropriate closed bands, as well as detailing leg banding procedures.

Meeting Aviculture's Changing Needs

Currently. NFSS has several committees working on various projects and additional new programs which are designed to meet the needs of members and enhance the Society. The Conservation Committee is working hard to establish a small grant process for consortiums and other avian causes, and the Breeder Recognition Committee to is at work to add Breeder awards to the NFSS awards system.

The diligent and innovative past efforts of NFSS have created an impressive list of active programs, and the ground work has been laid for

National Finch and Softbill Society BYLAWS

Adopted by the Board of Directors on Sunday, March 15, 1987, amended February 1994, and replaces those adopted on November 10, 1983 and September 8, 1985.

These bylaws have been adopted by at least a two-thirds majority of those members responding to a ballot acceptance as published in the official *Bulletin* of the Society. These bylaws are on file with the Secretary of State's office in Hartford. Connecticut.

ARTICLE 1 - NAME OF THE ORGANIZATION

This organization shall be known as the National Finch and Softbill Society. Inc. It shall also be known in a more casual manner as "NFSS".

ARTICLE 2 - STATUS

The National Finch and Softbill Society. Inc. is a nonprofit organization incorporated under the laws of the State of Connecticut. All necessary data is on file at the Secretary of State's office, Arch Street, Hartford, Connecticut 06105.

ARTICLE 3 - HOME OFFICE

The principal office of the Society shall be 18913 Boston St. NW, Elk River. Minnesota, or other address as the Board of Directors may from time to time select.

ARTICLE 4 - PURPOSE OF THE SOCIETY

Recognizing a lack of organization amongst exhibitors and breeders of Finches and Softbilled birds, and in view of the increased interest in them, we propose to: encourage breeding programs, enhance the knowledge of our members in keeping and care of these birds, cooperate with organizations for the

preservation of aviculture in this country, and introduce the enjoyment of keeping and breeding Finches and Softbills to all interested parties.

ARTICLE 5 - CALENDAR YEAR

The calendar year of this Society shall be January 1 through December 31.

ARTICLE 6 - OFFICERS

PARAGRAPH ONE

<u>President</u>: The President of the Society shall preside over all Board of Directors meetings of this Society. The President shall also preside at the National annual meeting. The President shall attend to the day-to-day operations of the Society, shall abide by the bylaws of the Society, and shall coordinate and delegate the activities of the other officers of this Society.

PARAGRAPH TWO

<u>First Vice-President</u>: Shall fill the position of the President in absentia. Shall be first in succession to fill the position of the President should the President be unable to fill his term. The First Vice-President shall coordinate the activities of, and be responsible for all Regional Vice-Presidents.

PARAGRAPH THREE

<u>Second Vice-President</u>: Shall be second in line to the Presidency and first in line to succeed the First Vice-President. The Second Vice-President shall chair the Education Committee and coordinate the educational programs of the Society. The Second Vice-President shall also chair the Publishing Committee as well as sit on all Committees of the Society.

PARAGRAPH FOUR

<u>The Third Vice-President</u>: Shall be in charge of "FINCHSAVE" the captive breeding program of the Society. He shall participate in the committee and guide the captains and breeders involved in the program.

PARAGRAPH FIVE

The Fourth Vice-President: Must be a NFS Panel Judge as he shall serve as the Panel Director. The Fourth Vice-President shall also chair the Research and Standards Committee and be in charge of Specie Classifications. He shall also be responsible for shows or exhibitions of the Society and member points arising therefrom.

PARAGRAPH SIX

<u>Corresponding Secretary</u>: Shall be responsible for all correspondence of the Society. The Corresponding Secretary shall also serve as the Membership Chairman for the Society.

PARAGRAPH SEVEN

Recording Secretary: Shall be responsible for the minutes of all Board of Directors meetings of the Society. Will further direct the recording of all minutes of special or national membership meetings that may be called from time to time. Will present to the President or Bulletin Editor a copy of all meeting minutes of this Society.

PARAGRAPH EIGHT

<u>Treasurer</u>: Shall be responsible for the collection and keeping of all Society funds and assessments. Shall maintain a bank account, and deposit Society funds in the account under the name the National Finch and Softbill Society, Inc.. All funds, with the exception of the operating funds, are to be kept in a savings account. The Treasurer will pay with Society funds, kept in a checking account, all debts incurred by the Society at the directions of the Board of Directors. Society funds shall be used for the Society business only.

PARAGRAPH NINE

<u>Leg Band Secretary</u>: Shall be responsible for the ordering and issuance of official leg bands of the Society in accordance with the then policy of the Society. The Leg Band Secretary shall report to the Treasurer of the Society.

PARAGRAPH TEN

<u>Chief Liaison Officer</u>: Shall be responsible for the interrelationships between "NFS" and other national and local avicultural organizations. He will also assist Regional Vice-Presidents with club affiliations. The office of Liaison is an appointed office by the Board of Directors.

PARAGRAPH ELEVEN

Regional Vice-President: Shall be responsible for encouraging membership and club affiliation in the National Finch and Softbill Society within a given region. Regional Vice-Presidents are responsible to the First Vice-President. Regional Vice-Presidents are to encourage at least one membership meeting within their regions annually.

ARTICLE 7 - BOARD OF DIRECTORS

PARAGRAPH ONE

The Board of Directors shall consist of all elected and appointed officers of the Society. The Board may at its pleasure ask a past Director to serve a term of one year only, on the present Board for the purpose of a smooth and orderly transition of Society business.

PARAGRAPH TWO

All matters of business of the Society shall be conducted by the Board of Directors on a quarterly basis, on the first Sunday of each quarter, or at an alternative time, occasioned by a National Holiday or other necessity. Emergency meetings may be held at any time deemed necessary by at least four Board members. The Fall Board Meeting shall be held in conjunction with the National Show of the Society. The Winter and Spring and Summer meetings may be held at a location as designated by the Board.

PARAGRAPH THREE

Any elected or appointed officer of the Society found by the Board to be injurious to the Society, may be removed from office by a two thirds vote of all Directors. To be injurious to the Society, a violation of the bylaws or a flagrant action against the good of the Society must have taken place. A written complaint against said officer must be signed by at least two Board members and must be received by the Corresponding Secretary by certified mail in order to be considered by the Whole Board.

PARAGRAPH FOUR

The Board of Directors may not occasion a meeting without first sending a notice to all Board members. Such a notice must be postmarked at least ten days prior to said meeting. Emergency meetings may take place when four members of the Board deem it necessary, without written notice. During an emergency meeting of the Board, no action may be taken on the removal of an officer or on an amendment to these Bylaws.

ARTICLE 8 - COMMITTEES

PARAGRAPH ONE

The President or Board of Directors may form a committee for the purpose of carrying out the goals and administration of the Society, without amendment.

PARAGRAPH TWO

Membership Committee: The Membership Committee shall conduct the membership affairs of the Society, and shall from time to time conduct drives to increase the membership of the Society. It shall promote the Society at any event held nationally or locally in the avicultural field unless such promotion should be contrary to the sponsoring organization's policy. The Membership Committee shall be chaired by the Treasurer of the Society.

PARAGRAPH THREE

<u>Show Committee</u>: The Show Committee, chaired by the Fourth Vice-President, shall be responsible for the annual show of the Society. It shall be responsible for the day-to-day activities required to achieve said exhibition, and shall he immediately responsible to the Board of Directors.

PARAGRAPH FOUR

<u>Publishing Committee</u>: The Publishing Committee, chaired by the Second Vice-President, shall he responsible for all publications of this Society. It shall produce and edit a bi-monthly bulletin for the membership of the Society. It shall produce a Handbook or yearbook for the Society, and any other publications as directed by the Board of Directors.

PARAGRAPH FIVE

Research Committee: Shall conduct research on a given subject at the pleasure of the Board of Directors, and will assist members of the Society with matters of avicultural interest.

PARAGRAPH SIX

<u>Education Committee</u>: This committee will assist its chairman, the Second Vice-President, in developing educational programs for the members of this Society.

PARAGRAPH SEVEN

<u>Standards Committee</u>: The Standards Committee shall work with the Judges Panel and other interested parties in an ongoing effort to establish Standards of Perfection for the individual species.

PARAGRAPH EIGHT

Judges Panel: Shall consist of all approved judges in accordance with the standards set forth by the Society. The procedure for nominating a judge for the Judges Panel shall consist of a written application by the potential judge, and nomination by at least two members of the Judges Panel. Nomination by the Judges Panel may not take place until the potential judge has completed apprenticeship and testing under the formula as then required by the Board of

Directors of the society. Final approval of a new judge shall be by the Board of Directors with a majority vote of the Board.

PARAGRAPH NINE

Apprentice Judge: An Apprentice Judge is a member of the Society who has applied to the chairman of the Judges Panel for the apprenticeship program. A copy of the requirements and program are found in the NFS Judges Panel Handbook.

PARAGRAPH TEN

<u>Finchsave Committee</u>: The Finchsave Committee shall assist the Director of the program. It shall consist of members designated by the Director and the Board of Directors. This Committee shall help develop and preserve policy in regard to this captive breeding program. Only the Committee may request funds for the administration of the program. All funds used for the program must be authorized by the Board of Directors.

ARTICLE 9 - MEMBERSHIP AND DUES

PARAGRAPH ONE

The dues for membership in the National Finch and Softbill Society shall be determined from time to time by the Board of Directors.

PARAGRAPH TWO

Membership is available to single members as well as dual members. Dual means any two individuals residing at the same address. Any dual membership will receive only one copy of an NFS publication; however, dual members will count as two individual votes in regard to NFS elections or other business.

PARAGRAPH THREE

Junior membership will be available at a reduced rate to any applicant under the age of sixteen.

PARAGRAPH FOUR

If a member's dues remain unpaid for a period exceeding sixty days beyoud written or published notice, said member's privileges shall be suspended.

PARAGRAPH FIVE

Membership in the National Finch and Softbill Society is a privilege. Any member who misrepresents the Society, holds Society property without authorization, or in any other way is injurious to this Society as defined in, but not limited to, Article 7. Paragraph 3, may lose his privileges of membership,

and receive a prorated refund of his unused dues. In order to cause action under this paragraph, a member must file a deposit of twenty-five dollars with the Society Treasurer, along with papers which shall support a claim against a member of this Society. Such claim shall be taken up by the Board of Directors. If the claim is ruled legitimate and results in the removal of a member, the claimant will receive his deposit back. If a claim is unfounded, the deposit shall be forfeited by the claimant.

ARTICLE 10 - ELECTIONS

PARAGRAPH ONE

Members elected to hold office in the Society shall serve for a period of two years.

PARAGRAPH TWO

Elections will be held every two years, or as may be occasioned by death or removal of an officer. A ballot, either separate or included in the official bulletin of the Society, shall be postmarked at least sixty days prior to elections. A majority of the ballots counted shall determine the outcome of the vote. A postmark as it pertains to this paragraph may be considered an official US bulk mailing facsimile certificate.

PARAGRAPH THREE

The Board of Directors shall appoint a Nominating Committee, consisting of at least three members, who must produce a slate of officers for the election. The committee shall produce at least one name, and not more than three names for each office. A write-in space must be allowed for each office on the ballot.

PARAGRAPH FOUR

All elections of this Society shall be by secret ballot only. Ballots will be counted by an appointee of the Board of Directors. Such appointee cannot be an elected officer of the Society.

ARTICLE 11 - QUORUM

PARAGRAPH ONE

The Board of Directors, having sole authority to conduct the business of the Society, shall decide matters by a simple majority of those present at the Board meeting. A director's votes received by mail shall be considered as if the Board member were present,

PARAGRAPH TWO

At least four memhers of the Board must be present in order for the Board to conduct business at a meeting.

PARAGRAPH THREE

General membership votes on matters of the Society are only considered for the election of officers, the amendment of bylaws, or as otherwise set forth by the Board of Directors.

ARTICLE 12 - MEMBERSHIP MEETING

PARAGRAPH ONE

The Society shall have an annual meeting held in conjunction with the National Show of the Society.

PARAGRAPH TWO

The annual meeting of the Society shall consist of a State of the Society report given by the President, an annual Treasurer's report, and a more casual discussion period when members may make their views known to the Board of Directors.

PARAGRAPH THREE

Regional meetings may be held at the direction of the Regional Vice-Presidents. Business is not conducted at regional meetings. These meetings are for the general membership of the Society and are primarily to discuss ideas which may he presented to the Board of Directors. These meetings may also sponsor educational programs for the membership.

ARTICLE 13 - AMENDMENTS TO THE BYLAWS

PARAGRAPH ONE

Amendments to the bylaws must be sponsored by at least two members of the Society and received by the Corresponding Secretary by certified mail.

PARAGRAPH TWO

Amendments to the bylaws must be published in a newsletter of the Society at least 30 days prior to the next Board of Directors meeting. Any general change in the bylaws must be approved by hallot of the general membership.

PARAGRAPH THREE

Urgent actions may be considered by the Board of Directors for earlier disposition. Such actions shall not constitute a change of hylaws in regard to paragraph two of this article.

PARAGRAPH FOUR

Any amendment to the bylaws of this Society must be approved by two thirds of those responding. Any such ballot may only he opened at a regularly scheduled meeting of the Board of Directors, or at any time designated by at least four Board Members.

ARTICLE 14 - ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

The bylaws hereby set forth in Article 1 through 14 shall be considered the articles of incorporation of the National Finch and Softbill Society Inc., and may not he changed in any way, subject to the terms of Article 13 paragraphs 1 through 4, as included herein.

Naturally he had read everything he could find on the Gouldian, but there were still some questions that he wanted answers to. Eventually he got many answers and some prize-winning birds from Mr. Hershel Frey, from Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania. The progeny of those original blood lines have consistently achieved Best in Show, or very close to that position in Puerto Rica bird shows.

While he loves to breed his finches in their cages, and tell people all that he has learned over the years, as a biologist he cannot forget his interest in conservation of species and habitat. Although re-introduction of

species has proved to be a bit tricky sometimes, and impossible at others, Dwight would like to point out that aviculture is in fact a barrier to extinction. Who knows, maybe some day the descendants of his Gouldians will once again fly free in the Australian sunshine. That, Dwight says, would make his heart soar like a hawk







National Finch and Softbill Society FINCHSAVE PROGRAM



FINCHSAVE — Definition and Purpose

Long term goal: To have an established consortium of breeders of finches and softbills dedicated to producing and maintaining a viable captive bred population of finches and softballs in the United States.

Short term goal: Consistent breeding success with participating species.

We hope to accomplish these goals through a cooperative effort of education, assistance and careful documentation of breeding results.

FINCHSAVE Requirements

Participants must meet the following requirements in order to participate in FINCHSAVE:

- Participant must be an NFSS member.
- Participant must agree to close band chicks with recommended size NFSS bands.
- Participant must agree to complete a brief annual report.

Participants are no longer required to have a minimum number of pairs but are encouraged to start with at least 3 unrelated pairs of birds if possible.

All but the following finches and softbills will be accepted into the program: Zebra Finches. Gouldians. Shafttails, Java Rice Birds, Society (Bengalese) Finches. any hybridized bird. The above mentioned birds are excluded because of their known availability or questionable genetic purity. The Timor Zebra Finch will be accepted into the program if it can be documented as the distinctly different Timor variety.

In return FINCHSAVE will assist participants in the following ways:

- 1. Provide benefits of NFSS membership including free FlNCH-SAVE ads. informative articles in *The NFSS Bulletin* and access to the NFSS census.
- 2. Assist participants by providing information on: where to obtain birds. I.D. bird bands. maintaining specific species.

- 3. Keep participants informed of program progress through newsletter or NFSS *Bulletin*.
- 4. Recognize participant accomplishments with their species.

FINCHSAVE Structure

Program Director: Administers program and handles routine issues as they arise. The Director will have a committee to assist with these responsibilities, so the workload can be distributed and better handled,

FINCHSAVE Committee: Appointed by the NFSS board. Will assist Director with setting policy and advise Director as needed.

Group Managers will supervise and provide assistance to Species Captains or perform the duties of Species Captains where needed. They will assist program director in developing management plans for species in their group. Criteria for Group Managers is that they have had successful breeding experience with two or more species in their group. Group Managers will head the following seven groups:

- Australian and Parrot finches.
- 2. All Waxbills.
- 3. All Mannikins.
- 4. All African finches.
- 5. All European finches.
- 6. All South American finches
- All Softbilled birds.

Further changes in group setups may be made in the future as needed.

Species Captains are responsible for gathering information from participants, assisting in obtaining birds, monitoring bloodlines and communicating with and assisting the Director and participants as needed. Criteria for Species Captain is that they have successfully bred their species.

The original program structure has been maintained except for the addition of the Director's committee. Changes in the program will be made as the need arises. For information or input contact:

Explanation of Requirements

- 1. FINCHSAVE is an official NFSS program for members. NFSS membership is also required to purchase the closed traceable bands. We welcome participation and cooperation with other groups.
- 2. Record keeping is extremely important in this type of program. Closed banding using NFSS bands enables the breeder to identify the bird's year of hatching. By using band numbers the breeder can accurately document the family background of each offspring. Since

NFSS band secretary records all band numbers, the hreeder of a banded bird may be traced. NFSS has a size guideline for banding different species. If birds are properly handed and safely housed, losses due to band problems are minimal. We have alternatives to banding chicks in the nest when disturbances are not tolerated by a species. We will explore alternatives to banding under exceptional circumstances.

We have eliminated the three pair minimum requirement but emphasize the need to preserve generic diversity. With fewer birds it is important to use only unrelated birds to avoid inbreeding. Short of genetic testing of each bird, the best way to obtain different bloodlines is to purchase birds from a reliable source who can give background information. If purchasing wildcaught birds, try to pair them with other hirds you have, captive bred, if possible. We realize that diversity may not always be possible with very rare species.

It is advisable to periodically obtain new bloodlines due to the short breeding life of most finches. New bloodlines are often needed for pairing up with newly produced offspring. We anticipate using the NFSS census as well as other sources to assist participants in locating breeders.

4. We need information from our breeders to learn more about keeping and breeding each species.

This includes: number of birds raised, number of hirds lost, hreeding set ups, etc. We anticipate writing up species management plans for each species and sharing this information with all participants. Participants will be kept informed through the NFSS Bulletin or FINCHSAVE newsletter. Participants are encouraged to contact the Species Captains, Group Managers or Director for assistance when needed.

Birds are not purchased by the FINCHSAVE Program. Participants must obtain their own hirds. We will help in locating them when possible. All offspring produced in the program belong to the participant.

Excluded Species

As previously mentioned, the excluded species are helieved to be commonly raised in this country, hybrids or of questionable genetic background. This does not mean that we do not care about these species, just that there are so many others to he bred. As a generalization, many of the Australian species were raised in captivity when Australia halted avian exports. There are some species that were not well established and are still quite rare in American aviculture.

On the other hand, there are many African. South American. European and Asian species which have been readily available through importation and therefore were not being raised in this country in



significant numbers. Their breeding presents more of a challenge with very little financial reward. These include but are not limited to Waxbills. Weavers and Serins. The Wild Bird Conservation Act of 1992 has had a significant impact and emphasizes the need to establish these species or lose them.

Since we do not have a way of knowing what finches and softbills are kept and bred in this country, and are faced with the continuing problem of habitat destruction, our emphasis and exclusions may change as we learn more. We will keep all NFSS members informed of participating species in an effort to encourage a variety of species in the program.

We encourage concentration on normal coloring as sometimes continued breeding of the normal variety is overlooked in favor of the newer color mutations. We are in no way discouraging hreeding of the mutations, but are interested in maintaining a balanced breeding effort for all varieties. There may come a time when we will be called upon to provide species for repopulation of their natural habitats. In order to do this we must preserve their natural characteristics and behaviors.

Club Participation

Bird clubs can and are encouraged to sponsor a species for participation in FINCHSAVE. It is required that the club and the species representative be members of the National Finch and Softbill Society. One person (species representative) can be assigned the task of gathering information needed for banding, annual reports and other feedback to FINCHSAVE. We are not requiring every individual involved in breeding the species to be an NFSS member. All birds should be closed banded and proper records kept. Contact program director for more information.

We have made it a practice to present these overseas awards at our National Show held in conjunction with the National Cage Bird Show. Each year we try to collect enough overseas awards to cover every section in the finch and softball division at the National. For several years, we have had at least two awards for each section.

When I first started this project. I also traded a few awards on behalf of my local bird club, the Illini Bird Fanciers. Once again, they "couldn't be outdone. I remember receiving two beautiful pullover sweaters from the North of England Gloster Club, each bearing the official insignia of the club. Our Illini club is still



The NFSS Apprentice Judge Program

As approved by the NFSS Board of Directors, November 1990, REVISED 8/94 AND 10/94 (changes shown in italics)

- 1. Any new apprentice is required to write a letter of request to the Panel Director, listing her/his qualifications.
- Qualifications MUST include:
 - Currently are and have been a member of NFSS for at least three years.
 - b. Have bred finches for five years.
 - c. Have exhibited under own name (or own aviary name) for three years.
 - d. Must have won points five (5) times in top ten in shows under (at least) three (3) NFSS Panel Judges.
- 3. Must take and pass a written test with 90% or better. If not passed, must study for one year and take the test again (not within one year). The test to be taken at the Kaytee Great American or the National Cage Bird Show, by pre-arrangement only, or at sites where Panel Chairman is judging with at least a 60 day advance notice to the Panel Chairman.
- Cannot apprentice until the test is passed. Each of three apprenticeships to be pre-approved by the Panel Chairman, the Panel Judge involved and the Show Manager of the show involved.
- 5. Once three apprenticeships are completed and satisfactory reports are received from the judges involved, the apprentice must submit a request through the Panel Director for final Board approval.
- 6. The apprentice must appear before the Board (or submit a *notarized* statement) indicating she/he understands and agrees to the following:
 - a. When requested to write a report, it must be done immediately. (Example—the three reports of shows to be judged.)
 - b. All show reports must be in within two weeks.
 - All judges must respond to all inquiries and must participate on Standard committees.
 - NFSS Panel Judges must adhere to all NFSS Judges rules and must judge by current NFSS Standards.



LEG BANDING PROCEDURE

courtesy of The National Finch and Softbill Society



The most important thing to remember when banding chicks is to do it over a counter or table so if the chick is dropped it doesn't fall to the floor. The age to band varies between species but is generally between 5 and 10 days. You can tell by looking at the ankle joint (the joint where the toes come together) and the size of the band.



Have the bands, a toothpick (or other small blunt instrument) and some lubricant ready. Be sure you have the bands "right side up" for easier reading.



The band is generally placed on the bird's right leg. Banding just before the parents go to roost in the evening will prevent them from picking at the band. By the next morning they will have forgotten about it.



Hold the chick firmly but in such a way as to not cut off its breathing and so that you don't harm it. Remember, their bodies cannot tolerate compression. Put a little bit of lubricant on the chick's foot and slide the band over the three front toes and finally over the ankle joint. The back toe will probably have to be gently pried out from under the band with a toothpick. The band now should be in the proper location between the ankle and the elbow joints.



Check on the chick the next few days to be sure that the band has not slipped off and that there are no scrapes or irritations on the foot or leg.
