

- \* Mr. Earl Courts has resigned as a NFSS Panel Judge due to health problems. He has served NFSS in this capacity for many years and will be missed by all.
- \* Ms. Julie Duimstra has been appointed by the NFSS Board of Directors to the NFSS Judges Panel. NFSS welcomes her aboard.
- \* Due to a NFSS member's concerns, the Judges Panel Director wishes to revisit NFSS' open policy (since inception 1984) regarding exhibition of finch and soft-bill species. It seems members are being criticized for exhibiting stock not bred by themselves.

NFSS has always respected members' individual choice to exhibit avian species. Historically these have been imported or domestic bred stock. The exhibitor has always had the option of exhibiting their own bred birds as well as birds acquired by purchase, trade, gift, etc. (unless specified through seller/trader contract). It is important all Board members respect our members choice of exhibition and NFSS open policy.

## What's Up with Gouldians in the Wild?

Most of us know that the ever-popular Gouldian finch is more prevalent in captivity than in the wild, where its populations have declined steadily. It is now listed as an endangered species. The causes for this decline have not been accurately determined but in the past it has been hypothesized that habitat change (fire and rain cycles), parasitism, predation, and air-sac mite infestation could be the cause. No matter what the cause, research must continue. Yet, there is alarmingly little research on the biology of these birds in the wild. Sonia Tidemann of Batchelor College in Australia has performed most of the serious work in the Northern Territory of Australia, the only area in the world where the Gouldian finch exists in the wild. Here I summarize a recent report on the breeding biology of Gouldians as reported by Tidemann's group in the journal EMU. The longer and much more complete (and scientific) reference is:

Tidemann, S.C., C. Lawson, R. Elvish, J. Boyden, and J. Elvish. 1999. Breeding biology of the Gouldian finch Erythrura gouldiae, an endangered finch of Northern Australia. EMU 99:191-199.

Although most of the observations of the Gouldian finches were made in the early 1990's the report was just recently published. The study was based on two independent sites. The Yinberrie Hills site gets and average annual rainfall of 42.6 inches and the Newry site gets an average rainfall of 34.4 inches. The climate is considered monsoonal with around 85% of the annual rainfall coming from November to March. As for nesting sites, all but one of the nests that were found and monitored was made in Eucalyptus tree hollows. The nesting material was Sorghum grass. The parents were caught and tagged with color-coded bands so each bird could be monitored from a distance (see NFSS Bulletin Volume 16 (5): 6-9, for my article on a similar banding method). The banding also helped determine if renesting occurred within a pair in the same season and/or in subsequent years.

Nesting hollows were monitored year after year. Some could not be reused because of termite activity, fire, or fallen tree limbs. It was noted by Tidemann and her group that eggs were laid at intervals very close to 24 hours and that incubation was 14 days with the nestlings fledged after 21 days. The average clutch size (60-nest sample) was 5.2 eggs. The average number of nestlings to fledge from a successful (and note she means successful) nest was 4.8. There were no significant differences between the clutch size and the proportion of clutches that survived indicating that egg survival was not influenced by clutch size. About 75% of the nests fledged at least one young and the cause of nestling mortality could not be determined. The egg success (i.e. the number of eggs that produced a fledgling) was about 2.5 fledglings per bird per season.

Breeding time correlated well with the weather. In Newry, the number of clutches started to peak in April. In some years breeding activity would cease in June but in others it would continue until July or August. The average length of a nesting attempt was estimated to be 43 days with an interclutch break of 17 days following weaning. Interestingly, the number of clutch attempts was only two in some years but four in others. One pair did have three successful clutches, one in February, one in March, and one in May.

The study sites were of limited geographic range but were large. Interestingly, only a few banded breeding adults returned to the same study area in a subsequent year. In one case the site was skipped by an adult one year but the bird returned suggesting the "off-year" nesting site was outside the study area. Pair bonding was strong within a given year and all but one of 11 carefully studied pairs bred together for the whole breeding season. One pair had a successful clutch and then found new partners (my note: don't we wish humans could be so faithful - but then again it was only one year for the birds!). In NO case did a pair bond extend beyond one season.

Within a breeding season, a pair with a successful clutch were equally likely to find a new hollow as to stay in the same hollow. Yet, 25% of the hollows could not be reused between seasons because they were destroyed. Some hollows were reused even though a predator had taken the clutch.

Fortunately, the statistics showed that 32 to 56% nesting success was obtained and this is within the normal range for other Australian multi-brooded passerines. Losses occurred from predation but also abandonment. In fact, abandonment was a more common cause of nest failure than predation (my note: they do not state if this is caused by the pair realizing the clutch is infertile or if they are scared away from the nest and do not return). It is thought that by nesting exclusively in hollows Gouldian finches may have a bit of an advantage when compared to other species, which may be more susceptible to predators. The annual productivity of about 2.5 fledglings per bird per season is actually higher than other studied Australian passerines.

It is thought that some of the variability in annual production of young is linked to rainfall, which affects food sources. The authors state that adult Gouldians fed predominately on Sorghum seed (my note: so why don't we feed them Sorghum?) and feed Sorghum seed to their young. This grass requires a large amount of rainfall up to January for vegetative growth to be sufficient to produce large seed yields. As for other limitations to breeding success, the authors mention that the reuse of hollows by different pairs in subsequent years suggests that hollow availability is limited or that some hollows, even with the same dimensions, are more suitable for other reasons (my note: if this turns out to be true I hope they make more artificial hollows so nest sites are not the limiting factor).

They conclude by stating that the reproductive success of Gouldian pairs should not be limiting the populations. The assumption is that if populations continue to decline some other cause must be found. They suggest that until further studies indicate that the populations are increasing the status of the Gouldian finch should remain endangered.



# Avian Conversations (Continued)

### **AVIAN NUTRITION**

Before we begin this next section, we want to aeknowledge the considerable help we have received in preparing this material from Dr. Alicia McWatters, Ph.D., C.N.C. Dr. McWatters holds a doctoral degree in nutrition and is a certified nutritional consultant. She has written a book on natural bird care entitled A Guide to a Naturally Healthy Bird and is a co-author of the book Super Nutrition For Animals! Birds Too!. Both are published by Safe Goods Publishing Company. Dr. McWatters runs a private holistic avian health care consulting practice. She provides long distance telephone consultations and in home consultation visits to local bird owners. She teaches her clients about natural avian nutrition, feeding, and natural healing methods. Herbal medicine, homeopathy, and vitamin and mineral therapy are a few of the natural modalities she incorporates into her nutritional healing programs.

Although I did not know this when we began to work with her, Dr McWatters resides nearby in the mountains of New Mexico with her family and 5 parrots: a Congo African Grey. a Caique, a Solomon Island Eclectus, an Umbrella Cockatoo and an African Red-Bellied Parrot. She is a former breeder of Pionus Parrots and African Greys. Dr. McWatters has a Nutritional Q/A column on-line where she answers questions on avian nutrition and natural health. Her web page: http://www.parrothouse.com/McWatter.html is a storehouse of good bird care advice.

Ross: If we say to our reader's that a bird's nutrition is important, the words are likely to go in one ear and out the other. But, if we tell them that most bird illnesses and deaths are the result of poor diet. they might pay attention. It isn't that birds are necessarily starving but rather that an unbalanced diet leads to other problems like organ failure, eancer or immune system suppression that eventually cost the bird it's life. One big problem is that there is not a great deal of solid information on finch & softbill nutrition and some of what we do have, conflicts. Most of what we know is inferred from studies done on poultry. There is almost no research done on the nutritional

needs of finches and softbills. The major part of the pet bird market is occupied by hookbills and that is where the research money (what little there is) goes. Manufacturers and distributors of prepared diets and supplements have sometimes been guilty of stretching the truth or shading the facts to get us to purchase their products. You have to understand though, it wasn't very long ago that birds were fed strictly seed and water or milk soaked bread! We have come a long way. What we know about bird diet has largely been gained by individual experience, and although this is very valuable knowledge, it is not always reliable. But, it's the best we have. Considering that there are about 8,500 bird species and only about 5,000 mammal species you'd think the scientific community would have shown more interest in birds over the years. Oh well...

Tom: I am going to start off by saying that no finch lives by seed alone. I am a mixed flight breeder, and in all my flights there are softbills or nectarines in with the finches. And I am absolutely amazed at what my birds will eat besides the basic seed mixtures. As an example, my Scarlet Chested Grass Parakeets, besides their seed mixtures, and besides their soft food, which consists of chopped apple, vegetables like broccoli, carrots, zucchini and brown rice, take: mealworms, nectar, grubs, and greens. I do not have a finch, including Gouldians, which does not take live food. Mealworms mostly, and I use the mini mealworms for all my birds except my larger softbills. I think that anyone who tries to keep finches without live food, and I include the Australian birds here, like Gouldians, without live food is doing a disservice to the bird and the diet is really not complete.

Ross: I do not profess to be a nutritional expert, and what I am going to say here is based on my own research, experience, personal bias and the help of some fellow aviculturist's who are far more knowledgeable than I. I hope that others who are knowledgeable on the subject will comment on what we provide here and offer their own opinions and ideas. I am also indebted to Dr. Adrian Gallagher, D.V. M. of the Parrot Society of Australia for his article. Avian Nutrition Part I which can be found at: http://parrotsociety.org.au/articles/art\_021.htm (remember this is an article about parrots, and there are important differences in the needs of parrots, finches and softbills). I am also indebted to NFSS & AFA members Kathy Dezern. Caro-

lyn Swicegood, Liz Wilson and as you will read later, contributions from some of NFSS's most successful breeders.

In many ways a bird's dietary requirements are similar to ours. But there are also some important differences. Birds are calorie furnaces. Their high metabolism means that their proportional intake of fats and carbohydrates is much higher than ours. If you had their metabolism and exercise regimen you'd be eating all day and would have trouble replacing what you were burning off (sometimes I think that would be a gift but, oh well! . . . ).

Hummingbirds sometimes have to semi-hibernate at night because their caloric intake is so high they would actually starve to death by morning. Birds tend to eat to satisfy their caloric needs and this will often not match their dietary requirements. Seed, for example, is a high calorie food but it must be only part of a balanced diet. Seed has been a favorite target of companies who want to sell supplements and fortified products, and there are limitations to seed, as there are with any single food. It is important for all of us to know what those limits are - in any food we serve, and to correct for them with a more balanced offering. There is a tendency amongst some aviculturist's to try to correct for these deficiencies through chemical supplements, but simply pouring on the supplements isn't a good idea. Although you may correct an imbalance, supplements do not act the same way in the body as natural materials do. Excesses of some of these chemicals can cause serious complications for the bird. You must be careful with them. Feeding birds is an art, and one that must be studied.

### WATER

We'll be talking about the various dietary components here, but I want to begin with a short comment on water and the importance of good water. Water makes up 2/3 of a bird's body weight and is contained in every cell of the body. Water plays a key role in every bodily function and good water quality is essential for good health. Our tap water quality today is declining and declining rapidly. We are finding lots of heavy metal, pesticide, fungicide, herbieide and fertilizer runoff residue in water supplies and in increasingly larger quantities. Agricultural runoff, lawn chemicals, and pollutants from coal fired power plants add a lot heavy metal toxicity to the environment that gets into our groundwater. We drink it and it is also absorbed by

plants and is passed along through the food chain. Plus, old corroding metal water pipes in many communities add massively to the metals problem. Water filters have become very inexpensive these days and they are an excellent investment for both your health and the health of your birds. Most of the experts feel that reverse osmosis is the best filtration system for the price. There is an argument that filtration removes some beneficial things from the water, and this is true. In removing harmful organisms and metals it also removes beneficial organism as well as minerals such as iron, zinc. calcium and magnesium, For my money a little additional mineral supplementation (mineral water) and an occasional serving of yogurt is worth the price to keep the pesticides, fertilizers, industrial wastes and other toxins away from my family and my birds. Some people chemically treat their water. Chemically treating water can clear up bacterial problems, but it also kills the useful organisms, But, treating water does not deal with dissolved chemicals like pesticides, herbicides, fungicides, industrial waste or heavy metals.



## The National Finch and Softbill Society Banding Procedures

The important thing to remember when banding chicks is to do it over a counter or table so if the chick is dropped, it doesn't fall to the floor. The age to band varies between species but is generally between 5 and 10 days. You can tell by looking at the ankle joint (the joint where the toes come together) and the size of the band. Have the bands, a toothpick (or other small blunt instrument) and some lubricant ready. Be sure you have the bands "right side up" for easier reading. The band is generally placed on the bird's right leg. Banding just before the parents go to roost in the evening will help prevent them from picking at the band. By the next morning, they will have forgotten about it.






Hold the chick firmly, but in such a way as to not cut off its' breathing, and so that you don't harm it. Remember their bodies cannot tolerate compression.

Put a little bit of lubricant on the chick's foot and slide the band over the three front toes and finally over the ankle joint.





The back toe will probably have to be gently pried out from under the band with a toothpick.

The band should now be in the proper location

between the ankle and the elbow joint.

Check on the chick the next few days to be sure that the band has not slipped off and that there are no scrapes or irritations on the foot or leg.
